The Tasmanian Motorcycle Council is 100% in agreeance with Minister Rene Hidding on the need to get tough on any person distributing and selling ICE in our view they should feel the entire force of the law, the Tasmanian Motorcycle Council also believes the penalties are far too lenient on laws relating to Drug Trafficking in Hard Drugs.
